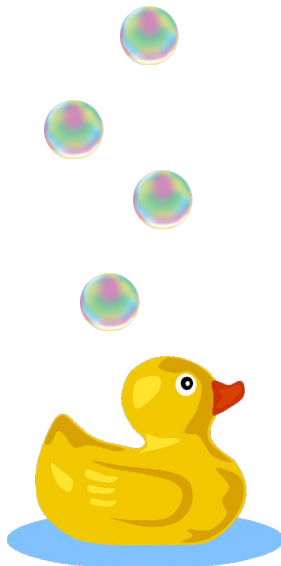


Writing a poem using a writing frame

I'll be if you let me.

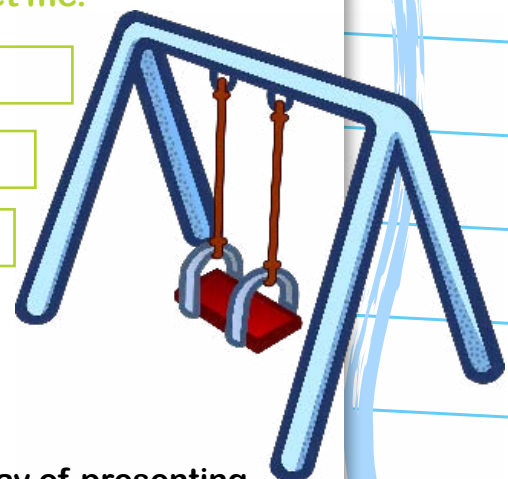
I won't
