

Oaks begin producing seeds, called acorns, at some point after reaching 20 years of age and before 50. Acorn production occurs during the fall and varies in numbers from year to year. After oaks reach 100 years, they will begin to produce an average of 2200 acorns yearly.

Extended learning activities are for your child to enjoy at home with you. Activities do not need to be submitted. This work will need to be kept at home.
