

At the beginning of the Palaeolithic period, there were several species of humans in the world. Humans first evolved in Africa, then spread to other parts of the world. It was just over a million years ago that the first humans made it to what is now Britain.

The map below shows what Europe was like at this time.

There were several Ice Ages followed by warmer periods which meant lots of changes in the environment.

The blue parts of this map are ice sheets. The dark green shows what the land is like now and the light green is what the land was like then.



This means early humans could walk from Africa to Europe!
