With the Government announcement yesterday that London has moved from Tier 1 to Tier 2, we need to be especially careful when following the Government guidelines. Please refer to the information below that we received from Dr Nada, Director of Public Health in the London Borough of Bromley. Covid-19 - help us slow the spread Please keep your distance at the school gates

The numbers of Covid-19 cases in Bromley are rising, so it is important we work together to do everything we can to reduce the spread of the virus and keep our children, families and communities as safe as possible.

That's why I'm writing to ask you to make sure you follow the social distancing guidance when dropping off or collecting your child from school please, as well as considering wearing a face covering.

Covid-19 spreads mainly through respiratory droplets generated by coughing and sneezing, and through contact with contaminated surfaces, so these simple precautions can be effective in helping to stop the spread of the virus.

Please remember:

Wash hands – regular washing Cover face – wear a face covering Make space - at least two metres (6ft 6ins)

It's a small price to pay to help protect our children, families and others, especially those who are older and with health conditions.
