COMMON EXCEPTION WORDS

These are tricky words that cannot be sounded out so need to be learned by 'sight'.

This is a word list taken from the National Curriculum of recommended words a Year 1 child should be confident reading and spelling as they <u>complete</u> Year 1.

Children will need to learn to read and write these words, and will be tested at the end of each term. We do not expect them to know all the words by the end of autumn, but will be monitoring their knowledge of the words throughout the school year. This gives you the chance to learn the words as we progress through the school year.

The word list can be accessed from the school's website.

Follow the spelling link and download the list to practise at home.

Here is a practice sheet you can use.

Practice a couple of words at a time; perhaps starting with the 1 and 2 letter words, then the 3 and 4 letter words and so on. You could also practise words with the same endings together e.g. by and my; go no and so; to and do; come and some etc.
