Cleaner Air Outside Schools Campaign

An idling engine can produce up to twice the emissions of a car in motion, churning out sulphur dioxide, particulate matter and nitrogen oxide.

All of these contribute to asthma, heart disease and even lung cancer, according to <u>Transport for London</u>.

These chemicals also have a negative effect on the environment by contributing to poor air quality.

So, to reduce the impact of these harmful pollutants, governments across the UK have introduced laws to discourage drivers from idling. In Greater London, leaving your engine on while parked on the road or in a public place could land you with a fine where there are extra measures to cut emissions. Bromley Council recently passed anti-idling legislation.








Art Day

With just one extra click when ordering online, retailers will donate a percentage of the value of your order direct to the PTA. Simple!



We have a host of outstanding and inspirational coaches, experts by experience and artists coming to work with the children and young people, providing early intervention work on antibullying, racism, crime prevention, gang culture, awareness of drugs and addiction and running county lines. A truly innovative approach combining fun, fitness, food and real-life education.


MY TEACHERS




My first day in year 6 was very nice and I feel like I settled in really quickly.
