
Friday 8th October 2021 Autumn Term Issue: 5



As cold and flu season is upon us, we need to remain vigilant as symptoms of these can be similar to COVID-19. We do not wish to send pupils home unnecessarily, but the guidance we have from Public Health is that if any of the three main symptoms are present: continuous cough, high temperature/ fever or loss of smell/taste, then we advise self-isolation and then taking a PCR test to confirm whether your child is positive. We cannot accept Lateral Flow Tests for symptomatic cases, this is because they are not recommended for those with symptoms. - Click on the waffle (the 9 dots arranged in 3 lines of 3) in the top right hand corner and select
   Drive
- Once in Drive, click waffle again in top right and select Classroom

Please note that it will take the Academy at least 2 weeks to process your request, when submitting your form.




#### Science Challenge

The chromebook we purchased from the school has been a great addition to our homework routine. It's set up and works exactly the same as his one at school so there is no confusion of different layouts and where to go. I'm free to do other things, as I don't have to constantly supervise to make sure he doesn't press the wrong button and gets lost. My son is now independent in getting straight to work at home.

The Lenovo Chromebook 100e 2nd generation is one of the cheapest Chromebook you can buy. Especially with a deal through our Academy, if you are looking for another device to access home schooling or any online work for your kids, this is the one to buy.

A Chromebook makes a lot of sense for a Primary School student who will be using it to access their work on Google Classroom as well as work on their homework on various websites required by the school from the eCollins reading library, Timestable Rock stars, Purple Mash and MyMaths; just to name a few.

It is a low-frills device which comes with limited features, a Chrome Operating System (OS) and access to the Android App Store. With this in mind, it starts up relatively fast and is easy to use. Ideal for basic browsing, email access and some low social media usage. It is also a seamless experience for our KS2 student, as it is exactly what they are using in school, which means it is easy to use. They can access Google Classroom and their required work that is bookmarked on the Google browser using their unique school email log-in; no excuse for them to not get their work done.

It was easy to set up. Just plug in the battery charger to get it charged, start it up and the Chromebook pretty much directs you on how to get going. The most important thing to do when you start out, is to make sure that it's the adult user's email address that is used to set it up and not the child. It only has 16GB of storage so you need to be mindful of how much you download. It has a 10 hour battery life which with light daily usage, only needed charging after a week. The speakers, camera and microphone for use on a video meeting is more than sufficient.
