Industrial Action

Thank you for your understanding over the partial closure of the school which took place on Wednesday 1st February. The strike happened because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teacher pay and school funding, and not because of any issues at our school.

As you are aware, employees are not required to tell employers whether they intend to take action, however we will do our best to give you enough notice to arrange suitable childcare. With this in mind the NEU has called for three further days on industrial action on Thursday 2nd March 2023, Wednesday 15th March 2023 and Thursday 16th March 2023 and you MAY want to plan for alternative arrangements.

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scables	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek


