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Letter from Councillor Peter Fortune and the Education Commission

The Academy has received a letter from Councillor Peter Fortune as the Year 6 pupils have attained 100% results in writing, with 31% of pupils attaining a higher standard. I have attached a letter for your perusal, and would like to express how proud of our Year 6 children we are.

The Education Commission has written to the Academy to congratulate us on our Brilliant' results.

Attendance

At St Peter and St Paul we aim to get 97% or over each week. The whole Academy attendance this week was **96.3**%. Year 3 has the best attendance at 98.4% gaining 2 stars on the space race. The other classes were as follows:-

Year 3 98.4% = Two stars on the space race Year 1 97.8% = One Star on the space race Early Years 97.5% = One Star on the space race Year 2 97.2% Year 4 95.3% Year 5 94.8% Year 6 93.2%

Summer Reading Challenge 2017

Last year's Summer Reading Challenge in Bromley had 5981 children taking part. The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children aged 4—11 of all reading abilities to read 6 books during the long summer holidays and is a great example of how libraries and schools can work together to prevent the 'Summer Reading Dip' and encourage children to read for pleasure. Children can read whatever they like— story books, factual books, joke books, picture books—and receive special rewards every time they finish a book. There's a medal and certificate for everyone who completes the challenge. Library staff and young volunteers listen and talk to each child about the books they have read and encourage them to extend their reading choices.

The theme this year is Animal Agents and the challenge follows the antics of a band of animal detectives solving a library mystery. Children can join the challenge for free at any Bromley library from 15th July.
