Last year's Summer Reading Challenge in Bromley had 5981 children taking part. The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children aged 4—11 of all reading abilities to read 6 books during the long summer holidays and is a great example of how libraries and schools can work together to prevent the 'Summer Reading Dip' and encourage children to read for pleasure. Children can read whatever they like—story books, factual books, joke books, picture books—to receive special rewards every time they finish a book. There's a medal and certificate for everyone who completes the challenge. Library staff and young volunteers listen and talk to each child about the books they have read and encourage them to extend their reading choices.

The theme this year is Animal Agents and the challenge follows the antics of a band of animal detectives solving a library mystery. Children can join the challenge for free at any Bromley library from 15th July.


