Indefinite article - a or an

Some words have 'a' before them and some have 'an'.

The rule is:

If the word starts with a vowel (a,e,i,o,u) it is preceded by 'an'.

If the word starts with a consonant it is preceded by 'a'.

However, there are always some exceptions to the rules!
