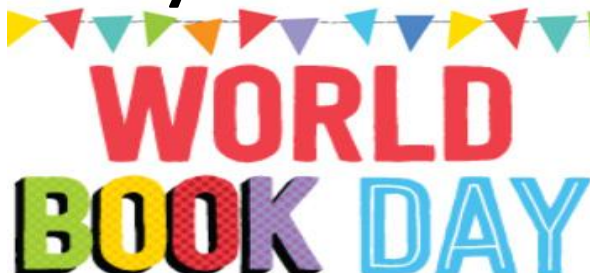




Academy Newsletter

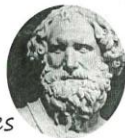

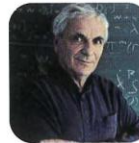

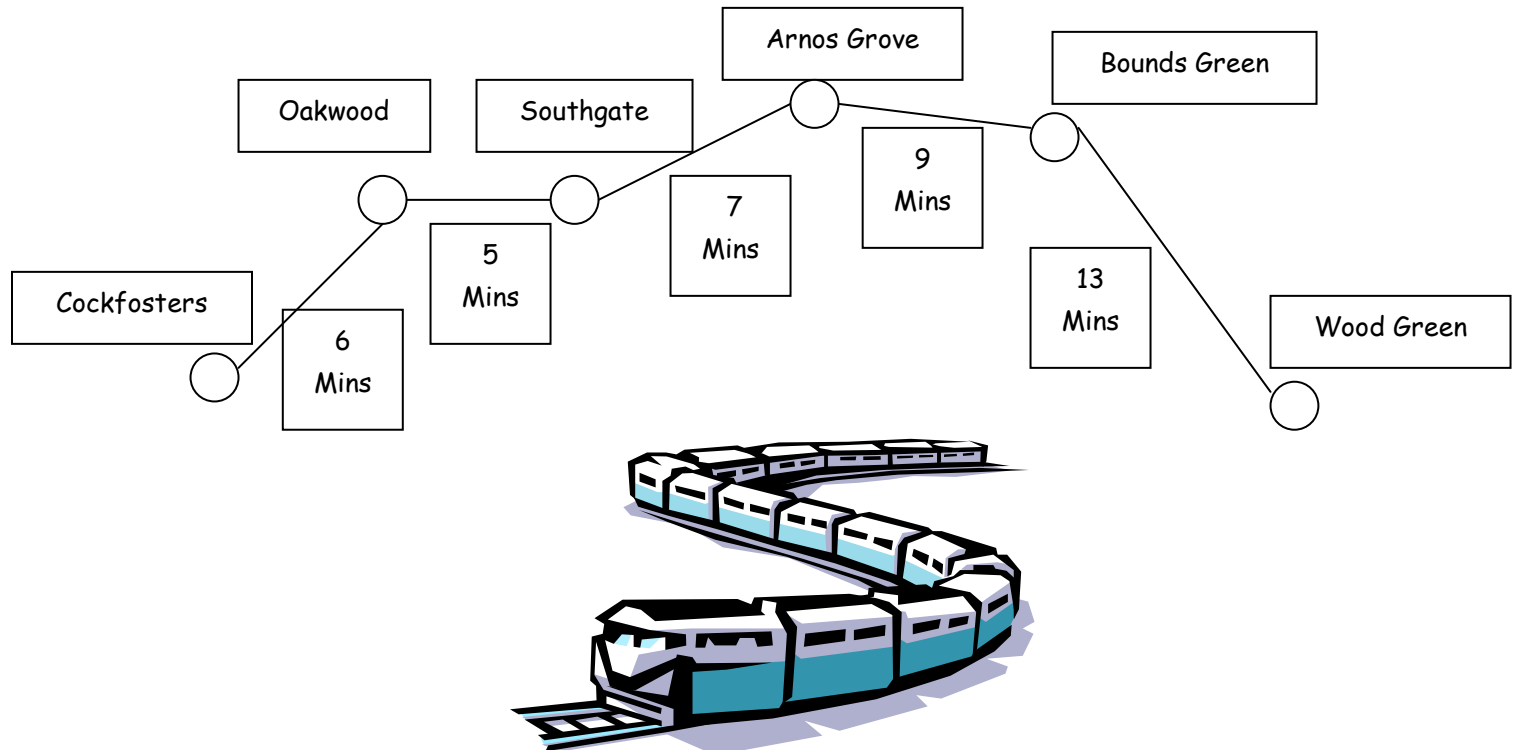
