Adverbials - remember they tell us about the verb - when (time), how (manner) or where (place) something happens and if it's used at the front of the sentence (a fronted adverbial) you need to add a comma.

- 1. The ogres approached.
- 2. The dragon woke.
- 3. The final whistle blew.

Examples, both are correct - When (time adverbial)

As the clock struck midnight, the spy entered the office. (fronted adverbial)

The spy entered the office as the clock struck midnight. (not fronted)

You might want to use some of these

Immediately In the morning In the blink of an eye Eventually

In the distance Back at the ground Down by the cliffs Nearby

Bravely Finally Without a sound Barely alive

Blue group

Rewrite the 3 sentences above but add a different fronted adverbial to each.

Green and red groups

Rewrite the 3 sentences above but add a different adverbial to each. Make at least one not be fronted.

Then, add a sentence of your own which includes an adverbial.

Purple and yellow groups

Rewrite the 3 sentences above but add a different adverbial to each. Make at least one not be fronted.

Then, add two sentences of your own which include more than one adverbial in each.
