## Grammatical features

Verbs - doing words that show what someone or something is, has or does - it is hot today; he has a dog; she walked to school.

Expanded noun phrase - an adjective or more than one adjective telling you more about the noun - the savage white dog.

Prepositions - tells you when (at, during, in, on) or where (to, over, under) - <u>In</u> the morning, the cat usually hides <u>under</u> the table.

Adverb - describing words that give added meaning to verbs, often telling you when, where or how something happened - in the morning, in the dark forest, he spoke hurriedly.

Conjunctions - link the parts of a sentence together (even though; unless; because; until; if; as soon as; although; while; when; before; after; as) - We didn't go to the park as it was raining
